



Douglas County Historical Society Historical Preservation Award

The Douglas County Historical Society (DCHS) celebrates the best of preservation by presenting the Preservation Award to individuals and/or organizations whose contributions demonstrate outstanding excellence in historic preservation.

The DCHS invites you to participate in celebrating the best of historic preservation by nominating those individuals and/or organizations you believe are most deserving of the Douglas County Historical Society Preservation Award.

Nominations for the DCHS Preservation Award will be evaluated on the following criteria:

1. Achieved outstanding success in historic preservation over a sustained period of time
2. Preservation and maintenance of historic structures and landscapes
3. Historic interpretation and educational programs for the public
4. Promoting preservation through unique and effective programs
5. Exhibiting effective leadership in issues of importance to historic preservation
6. Notable achievements in preserving the heritage of Northern Nevada's Douglas County

A jury will be selected to review nominations for the Douglas County Historical Society Preservation Award of Excellence.

Nominee Eligibility Requirements:

1. Any individual or organization involved in historic preservation is eligible
2. Nominated projects must have been completed within the last three years
3. Nominations may be made without the knowledge of the nominee
4. Self-nominations will be accepted
5. Historic structures must be a minimum of 50 years or older

If you know of an individual or organization who deserves this honor, please fill the attached nomination form.

Project Description:

Attach to the nomination form a concise description in 750 words or less of the project, program, organization or individual that is being nominated. If the nominated project involves a site, building or district, explain its historical significance, challenges overcome, unique strategies and activities carried out and the impact this project has on the community; include the people involved and how this project could potentially be a model for other communities. If the nominee is an individual or organization, describe their accomplishments and/or contributions in the area of historic preservation. If the project is a building, include the original date of construction. If possible, include "before" and "after" pictures to assist us with review.
